“Shall the City of Columbus, Nebraska, issue bonds in the stated principal amount not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000), to provide funds to pay costs of constructing a community building to include: library, children’s museum, art gallery, and community room; said bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates and become due at such time or times as may be determined or directed by the Mayor and Council; and,

“Shall the City of Columbus, Nebraska, for the payment of said bonds, apply funds from the **EXISTING** one-half of one percent (0.50%), sales and use tax as approved on May 10, 2016 for funding such project?”

FOR said bonds and application of said sales and use tax

AGAINST said bonds and application of said sales and use tax

PROPOSAL TO INCREASE LOCAL  
SALES AND USE TAX RATE**

“Shall the governing body of the incorporated municipality – the City of Humphrey – increase the local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%) and impose a sales and use tax at the increased rate upon the same transactions within such municipality on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax for 10 years after the effective date of the increased sales and use tax or, if bonds are issued and the local option sales and use tax revenue is pledged for payment of such bonds, upon payment of such bonds and any refunding bonds, whichever date is later, with all revenues generated by the additional one-half of one percent (1/2%) used for constructing a new swimming pool facility, and equipment?”

A “YES” Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor of increasing such local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%), then the governing body of such incorporated municipality – the City of Humphrey – shall be empowered as provided by Section 77-27,142 of the Nebraska Statutes and shall forthwith proceed to increase the local sales and use tax rate from one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) to two percent (2%) and impose a sales and use tax at the increased rate pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act, with all revenues generated by the additional one-half of one percent (1/2%) to be used for the public infrastructure project of constructing a new swimming pool facility, and equipment.

A “NO” Vote: If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to such an increase of the local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%), then the governing body of the incorporated municipality shall not impose such a tax increase and the local sales and use tax rate will remain

unchanged at one and one-half percent (1 1/2%).

Additional Information Regarding City of Humphrey Proposed Sales and Use Tax Rate Increase:

If the additional sales and use tax is approved, it will not result in a reduction or elimination of any other taxes or fees. All additional revenue will be used solely for construction of a new swimming pool facility, and equipment. The revenue will be collected for 10 years after the effective date of the increased sales and use tax or, if bonds are issued and the local option sales and use tax revenue is pledged for payment of such bonds, upon payment of such bonds and any refunding bonds, whichever date is later, beginning in 2021. The City of Humphrey has entered into an interlocal agreement with Humphrey Public School District #67 for the long term development of unified governance of the City of Humphrey new swimming pool facility, and equipment public infrastructure project specifically as is provided in the interlocal agreement for the cooperative use of the Humphrey swimming pool to provide swimming pool services to City and Humphrey Public School District #67 residents. Additional revenue collected from increasing the sales and use tax rate by one half of one percent (1/2%) will be used solely to fund the public infrastructure project of the City of Humphrey new swimming pool facility, and equipment, and none (0%) will be used for purposes of the administration of the interlocal agreement.
