All additional revenue will be used solely for construction of a new swimming pool facility, and equipment. The revenue will be collected for 10 years after the effective date of the increased sales and use tax or, if bonds are issued and the local option sales and use tax revenue is pledged for payment of such bonds, upon payment of such bonds and any refunding bonds, whichever date is later, beginning in 2021. The City of Humphrey has entered into an interlocal agreement with Humphrey Public School District #67 for the long term development of unified governance of the City of Humphrey new swimming pool facility, and equipment public infrastructure project specifically as is provided in the interlocal agreement for the cooperative use of the Humphrey swimming pool to provide swimming pool services to City and Humphrey Public School District #67 residents.
