The following sample ballot lists the issue for the City of Humphrey's Special Election in Platte County. Only issues that pertain to your voting precinct will appear on your official ballot.

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER

1. Verify that there is a signature of an election official at the bottom of the ballot.
2. Verify that there are no voting marks on the ballot.
3. **TO VOTE, you must darken the oval completely (●) next to either "YES" or "NO".**
4. Use a black ink pen.
5. **DO NOT CROSS OUT OR ERASE.** If you make a mistake, write "Void" across the face of the ballot and call the Platte County Election Commissioner for instructions at (402)-563-4908.
6. Complete and sign the Voter's Official Ballot Return Envelope. Any person physically unable to sign the envelope must make his/her "mark".
7. After voting, insert the ballot in the Voter's Official Ballot Return Envelope, (**DO NOT FOLD**) and **DO NOT PLACE MORE THAN ONE VOTED BALLOT IN THE Voter's Official Ballot RETURN ENVELOPE.**
8. Return your ballot by mail by placing postage on the envelope, or feel free to use either the Ballot Drop Box on the outside of the Courthouse Building or at the sidewalk level by the street for ballot returns, or deliver your ballot to the Platte County Election Commissioner 2610 14th Street, Courthouse, Columbus, NE 68601 by 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday November 9, 2021.

PUBLICATION BALLOT CITY OF HUMPHREY PROPOSAL TO ISSUE SWIMMING POOL BONDS

Shall the City of Humphrey, Nebraska, borrow money and pledge the property and credit of the City upon its negotiable bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed TWO MILLION NINE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$2,950,000.00) for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new swimming pool and related improvements for the City on land currently owned by the City; said bonds to be dated and become due and payable, both principal and interest, on such date or dates as may be fixed by the Mayor and Council of the City at the time of their issuance and to bear interest at such rate or rates as shall be determined by the Mayor and Council of the City; and

Shall the City cause to be levied and collected annually, a special levy of taxes on the taxable value of all the taxable property in the City, and all other taxes, in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds, to the extent not paid from other sources, as such principal and interest become due?

A "Yes" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such questions shall be in favor of issuing bonds, the City shall construct and equip a swimming pool and related improvements and shall issue bonds in the principal amount of up to \$2,950,000 to pay for construction of the swimming pool and related improvements. To the extent not paid from other sources, including funds available from the City's local option sale and use tax, the funds for repayment of the bonds will come from an ad valorem tax on all the taxable property in the City.

A "No" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such questions shall be against issuing bonds, the City shall not issue bonds to finance the construction of a swimming pool and related improvements. In such event, the swimming pool would not be constructed unless funds could be obtained from other sources and no ad valorem tax would be imposed on all the taxable property in the City to pay for costs to construct a swimming pool.
