When Election Held? Primary and General

Odd Numbered Districts Elections were held in 2020 and every 4 years after that.
Even Numbered Districts Elections were held in 2018 and every 4 years after that.

Term Limits of 2 terms since 2000 Elections.

Qualifications of a Nebraska State Senator

1. Registered Voter of the State of Nebraska
2. Age – 21 years or older
3. Residence – Lived for 1 year in district Representing.

Mike Moser – Owner of Columbus Music Company from 1977 to the present time. Mike Moser is a Former Instructor at Central Community College and Columbus Mayor 2004- 2016. Mike is on the Agriculture, General Affairs and Natural Resources Committees.

Up for Reelection in 2022.

History of Legislature # 22

1986 General Election - Lee Rupp was elected and Dick Ternes was defeated. Between 1986 – 1988 Lee Rupp gets appointed to another position and resigns.

Helen Campbell is appointed by Governor until the next election in 1988.

1988 Election - Helen Campbell is defeated and Jennie Robak was elected.

1990 Jeanie Robak was elected unopposed and then Jennie was reelected in 1994, 1998. 2002 Jennie was up for reelection for her last term due to the term limit law. Arnie Stuthman beats Jennie Robak in the 2002 race.

2006 Arnie Stuthman is reelected and serves for 2 full terms.

2010 Paul Schumacher is elected after a close election race with Mike Moser. 2014 Paul Schumacher is reelected and termed out after that term was over.

2018 Mike Moser was elected and is serving the present time.
