PROCEEDINGS OF THE PLATTE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Columbus, Nebraska February 18, 2020 Tuesday, A.M.

Pursuant to adjournment the Platte County Board of Supervisors met in session beginning at 9:10 a.m. Diane C. Pinger, County Clerk, Jerry Engdahl, Chairman

Roll Call and the following members present: Supervisors Liss, Micek, Kwapnioski, Pfeifer, Lloyd Scow and Chairman Engdahl

The Chairman informed the public of the posting of the open meeting laws.

The Affidavits of Publication were presented. The meeting notice was published in the Columbus Telegram on February 11, 2020 and the Humphrey Democrat on February 12, 2020.

WHEREAS, James Wilke a Platte County farmer is remembered as a beloved husband, father and grandfather to his family and a friend to many in this community; and

WHEREAS, It is altogether proper and fitting that this community recognize James Wilkes act of selflessness and heroism.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PLATTE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, on this 18th day of February, 2020 hereby proclaim that the new bridge located on the Shell Creek overflow on the Monastery Road henceforth shall be known as the James Wilke Memorial Bridge.

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Committee Reports: Supervisor Liss brought to the boards attention to E 29th Avenue.

Supervisor Engdahl: do you think it's necessary to get NDOT or the engineers everybody down and talk? Liss: we can do that and address our concerns but I don't know how much it's going to do. Engdahl: well at least we have a chance to address it instead of that's the way it's going to be. Liss: I do want to say with regards to the uniform act on the relocation system and acquisition rule. If we are going to get in any discussion on that property we should probably do it in executive session. Engdahl: the very first day they opened up the new lanes I'm living east when you turn on the viaduct and we got a single lane the semis cannot turn the corner the way they designed it. Now that was an engineer from NDOR at that time, but anyway so I'm just saying they're not perfect. I think Ron's entitled to his opinion and also we don't know what, I don't know if there is any increase cost to us but we need to find that out. Liss: well certainly there's going to be an increased cost to us there's always a cost. Engdahl: I don't know if Lance Lehr, has he even been notified. You know you cannot he has to have access to his property. Liss: that's one of the questions I asked Jodi whether or not he should be approached about this and she advised me because of the way this property was acquisitioned that we do not go there. Engdahl: I don't want to go there, I'm just saying I just want to make sure we recovered. Liss: I want you to understand that if we violate any of the regulations federal aid acquisition we could be stuck with the whole project. Supervisor Pfeifer: reported the drainage committee will meet after the board meeting sometime this afternoon. Supervisor Scow: I'm sorry you didn't get this memo sooner but I think the important parts of this memo, we have a short period of time to get this budget done. I think it has to be into the County Clerk April 1. And I think the biggest item is that every time I hear us talk about buying something and we always charge it to capital. And when we put the budget together we don't pull a lot of information from anyplace else to decide what's going into capital. And I think we need to start knowing what we're planning on doing with respect to capital starting July one. Some people come in and want cars and then want to put equipment those cars and they want us to charge capital. Well they're going to have to step up and let us know what that's going to be the coming year. And everybody else is going to have to know the same thing, to what to put in there. And then we decide how much of that we're going to put in there and take control of it throughout the year. Pfeifer: what we want to know is what their wish list is. The money is there, but we don't have to give it to allow it either. Scow: that's right. But we know what they are starting to expect and then we can make a decision during this period of time or whatever as to what we're going to put in there for them. Micek: you're right on Mr. Chairman. Liss: you have a capital funds, it should not be a Christmas stocking. Scow: it kind of seems like a bottomless pit and we don't want that kind of control over what we're spending. Liss: I understand completely. Micek: they should know what they're going to need and that's, Jim said we want to know that. if they want to go out more than one year that's fine they can give us that information when they put their budget together. But as far as put in their budget it's where it's coming out next year. Liss: yes I would say the capital funds should probably be used for emergency or unforeseen circumstances. Micek and Pfeifer: capital should be budgeted for. Scow: the director that we had at the combined dispatch has been released and currently being done by one of the former county employees and one of the police department lieutenants until we can find a replacement. Supervisor Micek: the only report I have Mr. Chairman, Gary from maintenance was down here Monday because the sewer pipe was leaking in the basement so Obrist came down on Monday, which was good with the holiday we were closed up, and the sewer leaking in the basement so that pipe was replaced.



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Public Comments: John Harms asked a couple of questions: first about the county's ordinance on jake breaking. Sheriff Wemhoff answered his questions. Secondly: going back to when Mr. Mainelli was hired as the Highway Superintendent. Do you roughly know what his salary is for that? Supervisor Engdahl: he's actually on a retainer since 2009. John: is there any look down the road to potentially fill a permanent full time Highway Superintendent will be full at all times? Engdahl: hopefully, that is the goal. John: is there a time frame hopefully the board looking at one of the foreman, may or may not be the right person time will tell. Scow: I think with what we have been dealing with the government agencies, I think we're very fortunate to have him with his assets he brings for us to work with all these entities we are working with. Pfeifer: also as Jerry said I don't think any of us plan to continue on like this the way it is. Things will go back. Fred Liss and Bob Schmidt go back to those days although we'd like to just won't happen. But when we do hire somebody it would help if they have an engineering degree to save us money in the long run with all those, what we're doing with these bridges putting in culverts and such and it's just because that. John: with all the red tape. Pfeifer: so that's a valid question.
