Pursuant to adjournment the Platte County Board of Supervisors met in session beginning at 9:10 a.m. Diane C. Pinger, County Clerk, Jerry Engdahl, Chairman

Roll Call and the following members present: Supervisors Liss, Micek, Kwapnioski, Pfeifer, Lloyd Scow and Chairman Engdahl

The Chairman informed the public of the posting of the open meeting laws.

The Affidavits of Publication were presented. The meeting notice was published in the Columbus Telegram on May 19, 2020 and the Humphrey Democrat on May 20, 2020.

Chairman Engdahl stated that the agenda be approved as written.

Chairman Engdahl stated that the minutes for May 12, 2020 be approved as written.

The Judiciary Committee along with the County Attorney met with Attorney Bill Kurtenbach Legal Counsel for Nebraska Cooperative Government (NCG) made a presentation to the County Board on the keno lottery approved by the voters in the primary election. Mr. Kurtenbach stated the county will receive 10% net after expenses are paid. He also mentioned he talked to four businesses that are in favor of the measure: The Elks Country Club, Shadows Restaurant and Pub, Shenanigans and Klub 81 near Humphrey. Various questions were asked and answered by Mr. Kurtenbach.

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BOUND BY THE TERMS OF SUCH AGREEMENT, AND REPEALING ORDINANCES AND/OR RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT.

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PLATTE COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

WHEREAS, it is necessary that Platte County, Nebraska hereinafter referred to as “County”, provide for the health, welfare, safety, and public morals of its population:

WHEREAS, the Platte County Board of Supervisors desires to engage in a program of community betterment as defined in Section 9-604, R.R.S. 1943;

WHEREAS, it has been determined that to operate an effective lottery dedicated management is necessary and the benefits of operating the lottery in conjunction with other communities in an interlocal agreement is necessary and desirable;

WHEREAS, a copy of such Nebraska Cooperative Government Interlocal Agreement, as revised and approved as to form, has been provided to the Platte County Board of Supervisors and its terms are agreeable; and

WHEREAS, the electorate of Platte County, Nebraska, has duly approved Platte County, Nebraska conducting a lottery;

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Platte County, Nebraska, that Platte County, Nebraska, desires to and hereby does elect to become a party to the Nebraska Cooperative Government Interlocal Agreement and agrees to be bound hereby to the same extent as an original party hereto and shall be entitled to the rights and privileges thereto appertaining. The Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors of Platte County, Nebraska, is hereby authorized to execute the said Interlocal Agreement on behalf of the Platte County Board of Supervisors. Prior Resolutions and/or Ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed.

Chairman Engdahl: I had this put on the agenda. We all see things from our Attorney and where or what the governor is doing and as I understand it in the future we could have 25 people or 25% of the capacity here whichever is larger at our meetings, that would be board meetings that's one question. The other question is, is it time do we need to open up the courthouse to all the traffic or continue what we're doing. Personally I think everybody can get anything handled in the courthouse they need to under the present conditions. Platte County has over 500 cases of the virus. I don't know what the hurry would be to open up the courthouse to all the traffic or continue what we're doing. Personally I think everybody can get anything handled in the courthouse they need to under the present conditions. Platte County has over 500 cases of the virus. I don't know what the hurry would be to open up, that's just my opinion. Kwapnioski: I guess I would echo what you're saying. I think right now until we are able to get more information and more numbers. I think it's good and as long as the constituents can be



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meet their needs I think we need to stay as is right now. Scow: I've got a question. Are there any offices within the courthouse not able to get their work done the way the rules are now? Engdahl: well nobody said that they have a problem. What about you guys anybody have any thoughts? County Attorney: I can speak for anybody under the County Attorney umbrella. We seem to be functioning and accommodating ourselves to the pandemic in ways that require some creativity, but we're getting by and I think we're getting by well and I would like to echo where Jerry's sentiment that we ought to stay the course. I don't see that Colfax County and Platte County could be deemed anything other than hot spots here in the State of Nebraska. And we started this several weeks ago and I think it's working at least. We have had no positive COVID-19 tests results of employees in the courthouse and I think that's attributed to the cautionary activity that we've been engaged so, I comment the board for their caution and we're able to do our jobs. Sheriff Wemhoff: I just want to add something just for everyone's information. The courts have begun opening up, they're not just opening the doors wide open to the whole entire public coming in. one of the other things that is going on I'm going to share with you guys for my own opinion. There are only three courthouses across the State of Nebraska what I've been told are the DMV is open. Which means we have people coming to Platte County from all over the state because we are one of the three places they can come and get their driver license information and meet with the DMV to do that. So as of right now they're all making appointments, they are busy, they have five people up in that office taking appointments from people to come here from all over the state to get their driver's license renewed. Jenny, County Treasurer just talked to the DMV upstairs they have three people this week and they are full and two people for next week. Engdahl: we don't have control over DMV but we do have control over the courthouse and I think we ought to keep it as we have, people make appointments and let them in that way we don't have a whole mob at one time anyway. It helps the offices space people out by using appointments to come in. Micek: Does the DMV set up appointments? Sheriff Wemhoff: they just set up appointments and basically I told them we don't let the public in and walk around, they need to come down and escort that person up to the DMV office so that the person is not knocking on the doors that have listed no public access. So they have to be escorted by someone beyond those doors up to their office. Committee Reports:

Supervisor Liss brought up the bookmobile and mentioned to Jerry Engdahl and Jim Scow they should have received a draft agreement from Karen Connell. He has a hard copy of the agreement and set up a meeting with Jerry and Jim and Breanna so we can discuss what they are talking about here. Engdahl: she (Karen) still hasn't supplied what we are asking for though. She didn't supply the meeting the repair costs. Liss: she did make a comment in the email that she's working on that. So she'll have something put together by the time we have a meeting. Scow: as long as we're on that subject, when I look at those statistics they attribute a lot of those check outs to out of county and I don't know how they arrived at that number. Do you Fred? Liss: No I don't. I agree with you Jim that's one of the questions I've got for them. Engdahl: they can read the library card. Liss: now for clarification for the rest of the board members I want to say, we had two full meetings with the city and the library and we had one meeting amongst ourselves. I know there has been discussion on that contract with Buffalo County and that situation. The only reason that I got the agreement with Buffalo County was to use it as a tool to see what other counties are doing. As far as going forward with trying to get some kind of credit for the time the bus hasn't run. I'm still looking at getting some questions answered on how much further out will we be looking at that bus not running. Now right now we're looking a little bit more at a few months. We could be looking at a longer period of time also. Supervisor Pfeifer: I want to address a number of things here. That Buffalo County deal, the last count that I'm aware of is there are 8 or 9 counties in the state that have bookmobiles or they call it a bookmobile it's irrelevant what any other county does. Our contract is our contract. Most other counties, I think there are only three, if I'm not mistaken, three physical type of bookmobiles like what we have in the state. Have bookmobiles or they call it a bookmobile it's irrelevant even the other counties to the west have a van or just a vehicle that run a box of books to schools. Some of these counties have one or two schools in the county. They can drive a box of books to the schools and then two weeks later take some other books and bring those back. The county I mean bookmobile and contracts and stuff are so different they shouldn't be compared in my way of thinking. Liss: I know the contract with Buffalo County compared to ours is irrelevant. Like I said before I just wanted to get that information out in front of everybody so that we had an idea of what was going on with the other counties. Maybe apply some of the language in their contract, like I said it hasn't been discussed yet and I just wanted to use it as a tool. Pfeifer: here is a couple of other comments. This contract we have with them now wasn't fulfilled and I'm a little disappointed in that direction. Our representative from the County Attorney's Office in my opinion isn't, the contract is between the county and the library. I don't think we're being represented from the county standpoint like we should be. I don't think they should be representing the library and that's the email that I read. It appeared that they also have a representative from the library instead of having a representative from the county. And I don't know how many got it, my email I addressed this issue. I talked to my own private attorney and he's the one who suggested, one of the comments I put down in the email and that is we pay the last payment of the contract. Therefore the



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county will have fulfilled their end of the contract but in return the library should have an account. The accountability is something that addresses the items of the bookmobile, the walk in service; they have not taken care of their end of the contract. It was suggested that the county be reimbursed or at the value of what we paid over and above what we received in services, be placed towards the next contract. And also we don't make a new agreement or sign a new contract until those things are negotiated out. It doesn't make sense to negotiate a new contract and start a new contract the first of July when you don't even know what if some of these services are good to be ready. So you people who are negotiating this have a hard task in front of you because it's a mystery what this COVID thing. When are things going to start running? According to my opinion the county should be granted some consideration for the past when it wasn't running. So that's what I got. Engdahl: Fred to you have any other committee reports? Liss: No I have no other committee reports. We just haven't had the opportunity to get to the point where Ron is at with his discussion though. I think that what we need to do is continue working on it. Engdahl: Fred can you check out one thing. The extension bought four machines at \$400.00 apiece. Just find out what that is or why that is. \$1,600.00 for sewing machines. Liss: I did talk to Jill, she said something about ordering some equipment a couple of months ago, but because of the covid she had a problem with the shipment so that's why the claim is appearing now. Supervisor Lloyd: can't recall anything from two weeks ago. Had a discussion on maintainer blades other than that I think we pretty much touched on everything. Supervisor Scow: well I've got a complaint. Is this the opportunity to bring it up? What makes John Harms think he needs to be on the agenda? Let the Drainage/Road Bridge Committee take care of his problem. Why does he need to take our time up with this to? Engdahl: John is in the room and he has brought it up before and he said he didn't get any answer. Scow: well I can't see why you can't convince one of the two committees to move forward with this problem. Supervisor Micek: Jerry Engdahl and Fred Liss we're going to have to have a meeting this week and review the bids on the interior courthouse renovations and we need to look at them as a committee and come back to the board with our recommendations. Let me know when we can meet to get this done at RVW's office. I need to set up a meeting to know when you two are available. Supervisor Engdahl: attended the NorthStar meeting by Zoom.
